Principals Message

We have made a great start to Term 3 and it is well on its way to be another successful learning term. We welcome our visiting students from China and Korea who are attending Freemans Bay School over the next month. We hope these families have a wonderful time at Freemans Bay School. Whānau Puna are having visits to the Corbans Arts Centre this week, linking to our focus on visual arts this term. We have the art exhibition later in the term, as well as rippa rugby, soccer, basketball, hockey, tough guy and girl challenge, netball competitions and we continue to collaborate with all the local schools to develop a community of learners through Kāhui Ako o Waitematā.

We said goodbye to Nardia at the end of last week. Nardia has taken up a teaching position in Japan and we wish her all the best with her overseas posting. We welcome the following new staff to our school. Theresa Pangari joins Adele in Whānau Wai, Jeannie Lee and Emma Guttman in Whānau Rau Tahi.

Although there is not obvious presence of contractors onsite at school, we are in the process of finishing off a few things related to our school build. We await a good break from the rain to get markings painted on the hard courts, to reinstate the bike track, and make good the field. Child proof gates are to be installed between the orange building and the carpark and wayfinding signage is yet to be installed. It will be great to get these last few items completed before we start the summer term. Meanwhile we hope to soon have access to the school field again and we know the children will enjoy getting back onto the big adventure playground.

Please use the crossings around school and buckle the kids up in the car. Keep your family safe around traffic.

STRIKE ACTION - SCHOOL CLOSED FOR INSTRUCTION

Dear Parents and Caregivers

The Board of Trustees cannot provide teaching for students during the upcoming strike

The NZEI has advised the Freemans Bay Primary School Board of Trustees that the teachers at our school will be taking strike action for a full day on **Wednesday 15 August 2018**.

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we cannot provide the normal teaching services during the strike. It is important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on the day of the strike. Fernando's and Youthtown will not be operating.

We know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike, but please be assured that student safety is our main concern.

Thank you for your understanding

The primary teachers' and principals' union has decided on a full day strike on Wednesday 15 August. The school will be closed that day.



The result is in response to member feedback that many wanted to strike for a full day to send a stronger message to the Government about the need for time to teach, time to lead, and turning around the teacher shortage that is at crisis levels.

Members felt the Government's previous offer did not address workload issues, extra learning support or ways to stem the growing crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers.

Strikes are legal under the Employment Relations Act. If our school were legally closed during a strike, we do not have to make up the time at the end of the year. Under <u>Section 65A of the Education Act 1989</u> when a school is closed for instruction for any day because of strike action, the school is deemed to be open in terms of counting days.

As with our Pay Equity campaign for school support staff, ECE and Ministry of Education Support Workers, it's essential that the wider community understands the reasons for industrial action and supports what we are trying to achieve for our students and quality public education.

Parent and whānau support is necessary to give the Government the mandate and courage to take the bold steps that are needed.

Primary school members are discussing how to talk with families on our day of community engagement this Friday 3 August. Support from the wider membership means a lot to primary members.

The key thing we want to communicate is *why* we need to take this action. It's about kids' futures. It's about attracting and retaining teachers, having more time to teach and having truly inclusive schools where all children can learn and thrive.

That's why we do what we do and that's why we're taking a stand - for our students.

EVERY MINUTE COUNTS!

Being late for school has a negative impact on your child's learning.

Being just 10 minutes late every day adds up to an hour a week of lost learning. Over a year this adds up to one week of school missed in a year!



Being late for class often means important instructions are missed and the class is interrupted. Your child may feel uncomfortable and on the outer with peers.

Children need to arrive on time ready to settle into their school work.

Arriving at least 5 minutes before the first bell allows your child to interact with their peers and teacher and get themselves ready for their busy day.

Attending School regularly and arriving on time helps prepare children for the real world, where it is expected that they turn up to work every day and on time.

2019 OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENT

WHAT TO WEAR: mouth guard, sports gear


Each team requires a parent manager to assist with coaching, communication of game times to players, substitutions during the game and all-round management of the team at games.
