# Principals Message

Many thanks to parents who have emailed us messages of support for the NZEI campaign for better conditions in schools and for teachers. We know that strike action is really inconvenient for working families and appreciate the difficulty you faced on Wednesday when our NZEI union teachers and principal were on strike. The issues that the campaign is about are very real to us here at Freemans Bay School. Schools are facing a teacher shortage crisis, with a 40% drop in people training to be teachers; and growing number of school-aged children. The demographics of Auckland indicate that over the next ten years there will be 60 000 school aged students across the city. We don't have the capacity to provide teachers for the school students currently in Auckland, let alone meeting the future capacity. The shortage of teachers has affected us at Freemans Bay School. We have far less applications for teacher vacancies than we used to and it is difficult to get relieving teachers when needed. Funding for children with learning and behavioural challenges is a real concern. The NZEI campaign is about attracting more teachers into the profession to meet the demand, and importantly keeping teachers in the profession, as many leave within five years of their teaching career. We are seeing a growing trend of teachers wanting to work part time as they want work / life balance and the demands of the job outside the classroom, is too challenging. We do appreciate your understanding that the industrial action is about ensuring that our children get the education they deserve.

# CHILDREN LEARN BEST AT THE START OF THE DAY

# **EVERY MINUTE COUNTS!**

Being late for school has a negative impact on your child's learning.

Being just 10 minutes late every day adds up to an hour a week of lost learning. Over a year this adds up to one week of school missed in a year!



Being late for class often means important instructions are missed and the class is interrupted. Your child may feel uncomfortable and on the outer with peers.

Children need to arrive on time ready to settle into their school work. Arriving at least 5 minutes before the first bell allows your child to interact with their peers and teacher and get themselves ready for their busy day.

Attending School regularly and arriving on time helps prepare children for the real world, where it is expected that they turn up to work every day and on time.


