Principals Message

We are delighted to let you know that our school website has been upgraded and that you can now view this on any device including your phones. Our school has been working on SchoolDocs to create a web portal for our policies and procedures. We are excited to announce that this site is now live and available to our school community. We have a contract with SchoolDocs for them to maintain, update and provide a process to review our policies through consultation with our school community. The policies and procedures are tailored to Freemans Bay School and are informed by Ministry of Education guidelines and researched best practice. We have provided information such as our charter, behavior management, how we report to parents etc and much more for you to have access to.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews requests from schools and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our board of trustees has the opportunity to view changes or additions and to comment on them before they are implemented. We will advise you when policies are up for review and how you can take part in these reviews.

We invite you to visit the <u>school website</u> from the Board area on the school website and press on the SchoolDocs button to view our new web portal. Currently our behavior and complaints policy are under review and you can view these and make comment on these policies by the end of term 3.

There are a few reminders in this newsletter of important events coming up, including the student led conferences and the upcoming parent group meeting. Please check out the calendar on our fabulous upgraded website regularly for upcoming events.

This week we welcome Marah Hoey to Freemans Bay School. Marah is an educational intern visiting us from Germany and will be with us until next March.

We have enjoyed Richard's time with us at Freemans Bay School in Whānau Wai and wish him all the best for his journey. Lily Jones is relocating to Keri Keri to be with her family. Lily has been a learning assistant with us since 2009 and we have appreciated her valuable input into our special needs programmes. Sara Jenkins also

is resigning to be closer to the rest of her family in Wellington. Sara's contribution to ICT, administration, marketing and promoting our school through wonderful images is noted, not to mention her dedication to the rock band each year. We wish these departing staff members the best in their new adventures.

We have been advised that the City Mission is moving to Union Street as a temporary location on September 23, for about two years. Their new building is constructed on Hobson Street. We understand that the Auckland City Mission provides a wonderful service for homeless people and that they will be supporting our families who walk to school by ensuring that the footpath and passage to and from school is safe and secure. To support and welcome the City Mission in their new premises, we are holding a "Donate a Can, if you can" over the last two weeks of the term. Canned food donations can be dropped off at the school office and will be taken up by our BOT members on the last day of the term as a welcome to their new but temporary premises.

The income from international fee paying students supports our school with staffing and resources and keeps our student donations and fund raising efforts at a lower level than most schools. Bridget will be acting principal in my absence and Anne will be acting deputy principal. I look forward to seeing you all again next term.



FRANKLIN ROAD UPDATE

Please be advised the closure of the Middle Street/ Franklin Road intersection and the opening of Scotland Street / Franklin Rd intersection is now scheduled to occur this Thursday, 13th September.



How this may impact you...

- Scotland Street / Franklin Road intersection will re-open to traffic.
- The Middle Street speed table construction is expected to take approximately 3x weeks to complete (working Monday through Saturday).
- Middle Street / Franklin Road intersection will temporarily become a no through road for vehicles.
- Middle Street will be local access only from the Ireland Street intersection.
- Two way traffic will be maintained along Franklin Road.
- Vehicle and pedestrian access to properties and between Middle Street and Franklin Road will be maintained.
- Businesses in the area will remain open during the work.
- The works will involve excavation, concrete breakout, compaction of base-course, installation of formwork, service upgrades, hydro excavation to construct new streetlight foundations and concrete pours.
- Noise disruptions may be experienced.
- Notified dates depend on ground conditions onsite and wet weather so they may change.

I will advise if this date changes again and have a lovely rest of your week.
